For my dissertation project, I am recruiting parents and their children diagnosed with ASD to better understand familial perceptions of child behavior and anxiety.

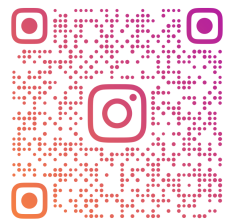
IMPORTANT NOTE

The responses provided for this research will remain completely confidential between the families and the research team. No published results will identify you or your child and no names will be associated with the findings.

Families may also be eligible for intervention depending on randomization and the initial study visit (see below)!



- Parent and child will each complete two online surveys, approximately 3-4 weeks apart
- Child participants will be asked to rate items about themselves (e.g., “I worry about other people liking me” or “I am easily distracted”)
- Caregivers may rate items about themselves (e.g., “I found it hard to wind down”) and rate items about their child (e.g., my child “shows sudden change in mood”)
- Children will also complete a brief IQ test over Zoom
- Each survey should take about 1 hour to complete
- You and your child may be asked to partake in two Zoom-based sessions facilitated by a clinician, each 35-40 minutes long
- Families will receive a \$50.00 gift card from Amazon at the end of the study
- Parents must be at least 18 years old and children with ASD must be ages 10 to 17 years
